INTRODUCTION

The Command of Jesus Christ to "Go into all the world and proclaim the Good News to the whole creation" (Mark 16:15) is the foundation for Catechesis or faith formation. This faith formation has been continuing in the Church from the days of the early Church in different ways. Catechesis is based on the theological positions of each epoch. A serious awareness on the liturgical, spiritual, theological, disciplinary patrimony of the Malankara Catholic Church led to the promulgation of a unique catechism for the Malankara Catholic Church. The entire Church rejoices at the fulfilment of this desire.

Catechism should never become an intellectual pursuit. True Catechesis should lead the pupil to a life of worship and witness. Catechesis should attempt to lead, nurture and confirm the pupil in the life of faith of the Church to which he or she belongs. Thus the catechumen will be able to know and experience Christ in and through the Church and participate in the mystery of salvation and be in communion with the Holy Trinity. Jesus Christ continues his Salvific Mission in and through the Church. Therefore we have concentrated on an ecclesial centred catechesis. This catechesis is founded on the spiritual heritage of the Malankara Catholic Church.

The textbook for class two is a continuation of class one. It begins with the sign of the Cross, giving Glory to the Triune God. The Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit of the Holy Trinity presented in the first class are being continued in these lessons also. From lessons two up to nine the hidden God of the Old Testament and those who have co-operated with the salvific plan of God are covered. From lessons ten to eighteen Jesus Christ – the Revealed God and events relating to his salvific mission are presented. The Holy Spirit and the Church led by the Holy Spirit are covered in the remaining lessons. Being the continuation of class one the intention behind this textbook is to enable the child to praise the Triune God with more conviction and experience. The salvific events from creation are presented here in the book. A selection of prayers from the Evening prayers, and Liturgy of the Malankara Catholic Church are included in this text.

Based on the principle that "the rule of prayer is the rule of faith", this textbook will help our children understand better the prayers and songs that we recite in our services and thus allow them to truly experience our Liturgy. The prayers, hymns and practical suggestions given at the end of each lesson give more meaning and spiritual nourishment to the child.

We are profoundly grateful to His Grace Most Rev. Cyril Mar Baselios, Metropolitan Archbishop of Trivandrum and the other bishops of the Malankara Catholic Church for their constant prayers, support and suggestions. My special thanks are due to our beloved Aboon Isaac Mar Cleemis, Metropolitan of Tiruvalla and the Apostolic Visitor to America and Europe for his continued support and guidance.

To the many priests, religious and lay faithful who have sincerely collaborated in this endeavour we offer our gratitude. I would like to thank Rev. 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




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




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GLORY TO THE TRIUNE GOD

(S'himo, Friday Morning)


Let us Do

Let us Do


I will respect and obey my parents.

THE FALL OF MAN

Let us Sing



I will offer to the Lord God the first fruit of the ground and other offerings.




Let us Do

To fulfil willingly his will.



Let us Sing



Let us Do


I will make offerings to the Lord in the church.

Let us Sing


We should grow in life obeying

At the baptism of Jesus, the Holy Trinity—the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit – was revealed.

Deneha is the feast that celebrates Christ's baptism. Deneha means shining light, self-manifestation and epiphany.

Since Deneha is the feast on which Jesus manifested Himself, we should go to the church that day and attend the service in the church.

And shall they rise form the dust


And put on the robe of glory".

JESUS STILLS THE STORM

I will pray to Jesus so that he may save the world from wild storm, earthquake and other natural calamities.


Let us Sing

JESUS MULTIPLIES THE LOAVES OF BREAD



When Jesus went to the other side of the Sea of Galilee, a great crowd followed Him on foot. He began teaching them. When it was evening, the disciples came to Him, saying: "This is a desert place and the hour is already late; send the crowds away so that they go and buy food for themselves".

Jesus said to them: "You yourselves give them something to eat". Then He said to His disciples: "How many loaves are there with you?" They said: "There is a young boy here who has five loaves and two fish".

Then Jesus said: "You order the crowds to sit down on the grass". Taking the five loaves and two fish, He looked up to heaven and blessed, and broke and gave the loaves to the disciples and the disciples gave them to the crowds. Likewise they distributed the fish as much as they wished. What was left over filled twelve baskets. Now the number of those who had eaten was five thousand. The people said: "This indeed is the prophet who is to come into the world" (John 6:1-14).

This incident reveals Jesus as a person who is concerned about the problems of people and willing to help them. It was just five loaves and two fish, which a young boy had with him, that were multiplied miraculously and given to the crowds. They all ate the loaves to their satisfaction.

Jesus will make manifold whatever little things I have if only I give them to Jesus wholeheartedly. I resolve to offer to Jesus all I have.



THE CRUCIFIXION OF JESUS



Jesus went about preaching the good news in Palestine. He wrought many miracles. He healed the sick. He comforted those who suffered. Large crowds came in haste to Jesus. He gave them solace and happiness.

However, the chief priests and the elders of the people took His mission amiss. They detested Him and were jealous of Him. So they plotted to put Him to death. The Roman governor Pilate sentenced Jesus to death. The soldiers struck Him with a whip. They spat in His face and arrayed Him in a purple cloak. And soldiers plaited a crown of thorns and put it upon His head. They mocked Him saying: "Hail, King of Jews".

Jesus was made to bear a huge wooden Cross over the shoulders and go to Golgotha (Calvary). When He reached Calvary He was stripped of His clothes and was fixed on the Cross with iron nails.

Upon the Cross, He lay suffering much pain. At the hour of His death, He prayed for those who crucified Him: "Father, forgive them, for they do not know what they are doing". Good Friday is the memorial of Christ's death on the Cross.

The Golgotha and the Cross erected in the middle of the church point to the passion and death of Christ.

Christ gave Himself upon the Cross for the remission of sins and the salvation of all people.

Let us Pray

"We commemorate, Lord, your death, We confess your resurrection, We await your second coming. May your mercy be upon us all".

Let us Do

Like Jesus I, too, will bear my pains.


Let us Sing

THE RESURRECTION OF JESUS



A certain rich man of Arimathea, Joseph by name, and Nicodemus (who at first had come to Jesus by night) besought Pilate that the body of Jesus be delivered to them for burial. They laid it in a tomb. Pilate made the sepulchre secure, sealing the stone and setting the guard. Since the following day was

Saturday, the day of Sabbath, all took rest. As Sunday, the first day of the week, began to dawn, the two women who loved Jesus, Mary Magdaline and the other Mary came to see the tomb.

They saw the stone rolled back from the tomb. They went inside the tomb and did not find in it the body of the Lord Jesus. Then two angels appeared and said: "Don't be terrified; He is not here but has risen". The women remembered His words that He would rise from the dead on the third day. When they departed to report all these things to His disciples, Jesus appeared to them. Hearing the report the disciples came to the tomb in haste. They knew that Jesus rose from among the dead. Since then He appeared to them on several occasions and spoke to them.

Easter is the feast that celebrates Christ's resurrection. It is the festival of joy.

The risen Lord had bidden peace to all whenever He appeared. So on the day of Easter we give peace to one another.

By His resurrection Jesus defeated death. As Jesus died and rose from among the dead, those of us who believe in Jesus will rise even if we die.

I will pray so that all may live in peace.



THE DESCENT OF THE HOLY SPIRIT



On the fortieth day after His resurrection, Jesus the Lord was taken up into heaven. This event is known as the Ascension of our Lord. The Church celebrates the Feast of the Ascension.

On the tenth day after the Ascension, Christ sent down the

Paraclete. And the Holy Spirit in the form of tongues of fire descended upon Mother Mary and the disciples when they were at prayer.

They were filled with the Holy Spirit. This event is celebrated as the Feast of Pentecost.

It was on the day of Pentecost that the Church was founded. On that day itself more than three thousand people were baptised.

Since then the disciples began to teach and preach the good news to the people.

The Church is guided by the Holy Spirit. The Holy Spirit is God Himself. He is the Third Person of the Holy Trinity.

"O God, the Holy Spirit, bless us".

Everyday before I study my lessons, I will pray to God the Holy Spirit.



THE HOLY QURBONO



The Holy Qurbono or Eucharist is the most important worship of God. In the Holy Qurbono we recall Christ's nativity and public life, passion and death, resurrection and ascension, the descent of the Holy Spirit and look forward to the second coming.

The Holy Qurbono is the sacrament that commemorates all these and offers worship and thanksgiving to God.

At the last supper Jesus took bread and gave thanks, and broke and gave it to His disciples, saying: "Take and eat of it. This is My body".

In like manner He took also the cup; He gave thanks and gave it to them saying: "This is My blood; all of you drink of this".

Thus Jesus changed the bread and wine into His body and blood and gave them to His disciples. He said: "Do this in remembrance of me". This command given at the last supper is continuously obeyed in the Holy Qurbono.

It is my responsibility to attend the Holy Qurbono on all Sundays and other Feast days. Hence I will go to the church on time and participate in the Holy Qurbono. I will attend the Holy Qurbono devoutly and praise and worship God and thank God for all the blessings He has showered on me.

Let us Pray

"This Holy Qurbono is blessing and peace, sacrifice and praise".

Let us Do

I will attend the Holy Qurbono without fail on all Sundays. I will sing aloud the hymns and join the prayers of the liturgy.

And keeps my precepts


Is my friend indeed.

CEMETERY



Cemetery is the ground where the faithful dead are buried. It is also called burial-ground. Cemetery is made in a place close to the church. As the church and its precincts are sacred, so is the burial-ground. It is gracious to recall the dead and pray for them.

(Order of the Malankara Qurbono)


Let us Do

MAR THOMA, THE APOSTLE



Tradition has it that Mar Thoma, the Apostle of our Lord Jesus Christ, landed at Kodungalloor, Kerala in A.D. 52. There he preached the gospel of our Lord and many families converted to the Christian faith. Mar Thoma founded seven churches in different places in Kerala. These seven centres are

Kodungalloor, Palayur, Kottakavu, Kokkamangalom, Niranam, Kollam and Nilackal. **Mar Thoma is the Apostle of India.**

Mar Thoma is the Apostle who founded Christianity in India. So the descendants of Mar Thoma are called Mar Thoma Christians. In A. D. 72 Mar Thoma received the palm of martyrdom on Chinnamalai near Mylapore, Madras. His disciples buried him there. Today the place is rechristened as St. Thomas Mount.

The Churches in India celebrate the feast of Mar Thoma on July 3 and it is known as *Dukarono*.

The Malankara Catholic Church to which we belong forms part of the Apostolic Tradition of Mar Thoma.
